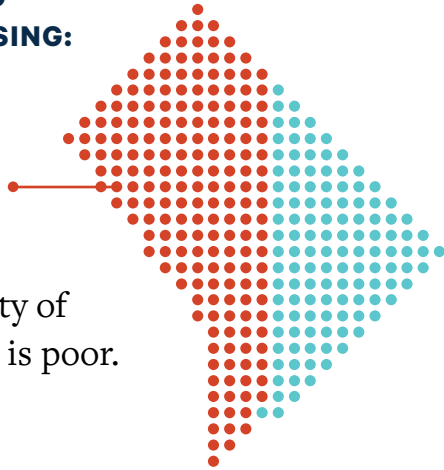

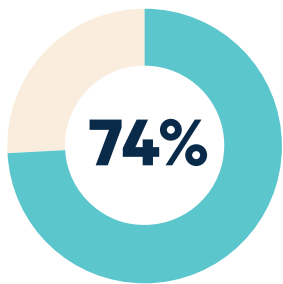

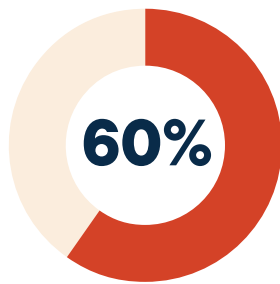
PERSONAL EXPERIENCES WITH

 personally know someone who has experienced homelessness or who is at risk of becoming homeless.

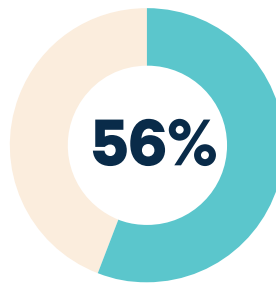

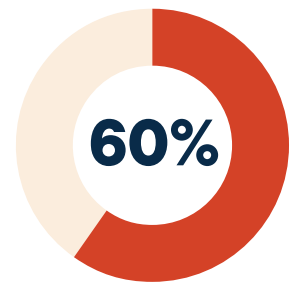
